Friday: It's a Laua Celebration Dress in your Hawaiian shirt and celebrate the year!

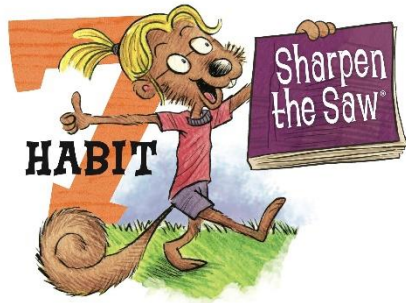
